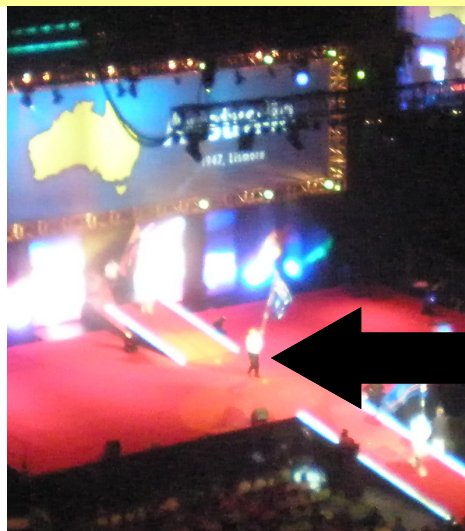
Our Tail Twister, Lion Ron Smircich, has some great stories, jokes and other tidbits he'll be sharing, which will add more fun to the evenings.
